E-cigarettes

- Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS), including electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes), are novel tobacco-free nicotine delivery devices.
- Vaping: Inhale and exhale the vapor produced by an electronic cigarette or similar device
- They do not contain tobacco, however the nicotine may be derived from tobacco.
- Solution contains 3 main ingredients:
 - Propylene Glycol or Vegetable Glycerin (Humectant)
 - Nicotine
 - Flavor (fruit, candy, tobacco, coffee, bacon, mix and match)









Youth use has more than tripled

 E-cigarettes are now the most commonly used tobacco product among youth.

• In 2016, more than 2 million U.S. middle and high school students used e-cigarettes in the past 30 days, including 4.3% of middle school students and 11.3% of high school students.

New Tobacco Laws in California

- In 2016 the age to purchase tobacco products is now 21
- New STAKE Act sticker required at registers
- E-cigarettes are now defined as tobacco products and subject to taxation
- Tax on a pack cigarettes raised by \$2.00

The Sale of Tobacco Products to Persons **Under 21** Years of Age Is Prohibited by Law and Subject to Penalties

To Report an Unlawful Tobacco Sale Call
1-800-5 ASK-4-ID

U.S. Armed Forces active duty personnel with military ID must be at least 18 years of age

Valid Identification May Be Required

This sign must be readable by the consumer and must not be altered, covered or obliterated in whole or in part

Health Implications

Nicotine

- Nicotine is a highly addictive neurotoxin
- Especially vulnerable to the toxic effect of nicotine
- 9 out of 10 lifelong smokers start before the age of 18

Flavoring

- Certain chemicals present in e-liquids are unsafe for inhalation
- Diacetyl, when inhaled, is associated with loss of pulmonary function





E-cigarettes

Nicotine Addiction: The Next Generation

- Vaporizes liquid nicotine among other chemicals
- Varying degrees of nicotine potency delivered
- Long term health Impact still to be determined
- Potential Life Saving Cessation Device
- Explosion in popularity; emergence of a subculture; the new "in thing" in Hollywood



The Aerosol: It's not just Water Vapor

E-Cigarette Vapor

- Concentrations of pollutants less than in cigarettes
- Carcinogens, less than in cigarettes
- Great variation across products; no product standards
- Intermediate and long term health effects unknown
- Maybe safer, but this doesn't mean safe



"On average, every three hours, a poison center receives a call about a young child exposed to an ecigarette or liquid nicotine," said the study's senior author, Dr. Gary Smith, director of the Center for Injury Research and Policy at Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus, Ohio. "That's more than seven children each day."



"If you look at the container that the liquid is for the electronic cigarettes, it's in a small, almost looks like an eyedropper container or even some of those candies, have you seen, that you drip into your mouth," said Julie Weber, the Missouri Poison Center Director. "And just 1 milliliter is enough to cause a problem in a young child."



What do they look like?

- Variety in appearance
- Customizable
- Homemade "mods" with bigger batteries produce more vapor
- Some e-cigarettes are disposable, others are
 - rechargeable/refillable

electronics than cigarettes.








Sometimes Glamorous







