II. Meeting Minutes Approval: November 8, 2018.

Meeting minutes were accepted into the record as presented.

III. Treasurer's Report: Aaron Byzak, Treasurer.

- General Account: \$6076.38 (Aaron noted that this amount includes \$5K sponsorship from TCMC)
- Youth Coalition: \$184.87
- GoFundMe Acct. #1: \$313.58 (Youth Coalition Activities)
- 420 REMIX Carryover: \$166.28
- Eastside Neighborhood Assoc: \$1642.40

IV. Presentation: Aaron Byzak, Tri City Medical Center.

Aaron shared the following points regarding the TCMC Behavioral Health Unit:

- TCMC decisions must meet TCMC mission, vision and values
- TCMC cannot employ physicians due to state law only partners and contracts with other agencies for physicians
- Tri-city regional population is over 400,000 and TCMC has been serving the region since 1961
- Campus redevelopment is essential to meet 2030 seismic compliance; parking structure is part of the development along with new patient bed tower
- HUD program can provide funding for development of medical facilities; TCMC has received one round of funding and is preparing for a second
- Behavioral Health Unit was suspended as of October 3, 2018, for three reasons: federal regulatory changes related to the
 environment of care, significant losses due to poor reimbursement for services, and a national shortage of psychiatrists
 impacting staffing

Aaron also presented on Tri-City Medical Center's extensive outreach since the decision and provided an overview of dozens of policy and practice reform recommendations related to behavioral health.

V. Program Updates: NCPC Program Staff.

Thanksgiving Sticker Shock Campaign was held Nov. 19; high school and college students (members of NCPC's youth coalition clubs and the STOP Act Grant sub-committee) visited 20 alcohol retailers in Vista and Oceanside to place over 1000 stickers on beer cartons in an effort to increase public awareness and remind buyers/party hosts that it is illegal to provide alcohol to minors. Students participating in this event from *Be the Resistance* Youth Coalition club were interviewed by KUSI.

Healthy Holiday Hike is planned for Saturday, Dec. 15th at Buena Vista Park in Vista, 9am-noon. High school and college students will participate to encourage healthy choices during the holiday season.

Holiday Celebration for NCPYC club members is being planned for Friday, Dec. 21st at a local ice skating rink or trampoline venue; 20-25 youth are expected to participate.

420 Remix is tentatively being planned for April 18th at Boomers in Vista. NCPC board members have been discussing possibly "rebranding" the event and is open to any recommendations or suggestions from NCPC members.
