
OVERALL GOAL: Increase perception of harm of daily marijuana use by high school students.

The North San Diego County NAACP Youth Council will work with Vista Community Clinic and the North Coastal Prevention Coalition to build leadership and advocacy skills among Youth Council members, advocate to prioritize youth prevention with local cannabis tax revenue in Oceanside and Vista, and utilize peer support and policy change to prevent youth vaping.




Why? - Marijuana Use and Vaping Increasing
