PREVENTION EXPERTS DISCUSS RISKS OF UNDERAGE DRINKING SESSIONS OFFERED IN BOTH ENGLISH AND SPANISH Opportunity to learn about underage drinking prevention and encourage family communication

WHY:

- To increase awareness for teens, parents and the community of the risks of underage drinking, and community efforts to reduce the problem.
- Youth who drink before age 15 are seven times more likely to develop alcohol problems than those who begin drinking at the legal age of 21 (2002-2006 National Surveys on Drug Use and Health).
- According to the 2009 CA Healthy Kids Survey, alcohol is the most abused drug by youth 20% of 7th graders and 39% of 11th graders in Oceanside report drinking alcohol in the past 30 days.
- According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (G. Smith et. al 1999), alcohol is a contributing factor in the leading causes of death for teens and young adults, including motor vehicle crashes, homicides and suicides.
