- The breweries must get a Administrative CUP to open. This was a win for the neighborhoods that are just off Coast Highway.

K 1 Speed Alcohol License Denied

On August 23rd the Carlsbad City Council voted 4-1 to uphold our protest and denied K1 Speed an alcohol license. Results from NCPC Survey was clear community members overwhelming opposed alcohol at K1 Speed.

- •Nearly 250 responses, just over half have been to K1 Speed.
- •70% opposed to alcohol at K1 Speed; just under 20% support.
- •Top concerns:
 - Customers driving after drinking (56%)
 - •Promoting racing and alcohol sends a mixed message (52%)
 - •Unsafe environment for youth and/or other drivers (51%)
- •66% of respondents are Carlsbad residents, primarily adults.
